

Nonhuman Primate Dentistry Chart Abbreviations

AT – Avulsion: Separation of tooth from alveolus

CA – Carious Lesion: Also called a cavity. Crater-like lesions, feel soft when probed.

C – Calculus:

- **C/sl** – Calculus slight
- **C/mod** – Calculus moderate
- **C/h** – Calculus heavy

F – Furcation Exposure

- **F1** – Explorer can enter the furcation but does not exit the other side.
- **F2** – Explorer enters and exits through other side.

FX – Fractured Tooth

- **FX1** – Enamel fractured with dentin exposed.
- **FX2** – Dentin and pulp exposure.

G – Gingivitis

- **G1** – Mild.
- **G2** – Erythema, bleeding on probing.
- **G3** – Severe erythema, swelling, bleeding on probing.

GR – Gum Recession: Areas where the gingival margin is below the cemento-enamel junction.

O – Missing Tooth

ONF – Oronasal Fistula: An abnormal communication between the mouth and the nasal cavity.

P – Pulpotomy: Typically performed when disarming canine teeth.

PP – Periodontal Pocket

RT – Root Canal Therapy

R/A – Restoration-Amalgam

R/C – Restoration-Composite

W – Worn Tooth
